#### **Local Government Reorganisation Update**

All the councils across Hampshire are now working on proposals for new council areas across the county. Detailed work is ongoing with KPMG.

Politically, it is becoming clear (and is not unexpected) that not everyone will agree on the new boundaries. There are councils which are minded to merge as entire units, and councils which are advocating for existing districts to be broken up. Gosport has withdrawn from the work entirely.

The final submissions will be submitted at the end of September. You will see over the summer that several councils are going public with their preferences — they will almost certainly conflict with one another.

Who therefore breaks the deadlock? That is the key question which will determine if, how and when this project goes ahead. It will in all likelihood be based on areas which have a sustainable population, such as a good balance between young and old, employment opportunities and logical geography. The reason why we are undertaking the work with KPMG is to try to propose boundaries which are along the same lines as government advisors will work, as this brings the highest chance of synergy between our preferences and theirs.

Ultimately should the government agree to districts being broken up, the matter would likely be referred to the Local Government Boundary Commission which would result in a public inquiry which could delay the process considerably. If they go down the statutory route then it would need to be allocated parliamentary time. We may well be in the position that the timetable slips, or that it is put on ice. I can assure you that we are preparing for all eventualities.

In terms of parishes, there will be a process whereby Test Valley Borough Council considers whether or not to devolve any responsibilities, and whether these are wanted or not by parishes. This piece of work will begin shortly and I will be engaging with each parish separately on it to establish your views.

#### **Draft Local Nature Recovery Strategy**

The public are being asked for their views on the Draft Local Nature Recovery Strategy for Hampshire which sets out a series of biodiversity priorities to help reverse nature's decline

Produced in conjunction with a wide range of organisations\*, the draft strategy maps the most valuable existing habitat for nature, setting out proposals for creating, restoring and enhancing habitats, and suggests priorities and targets for nature's recovery.

The public consultation is open until 23 June.

Among a broad range of suggested priorities and actions, the draft strategy includes proposals that could:

- shape how future funding for farming and land management is used
- help local planning authorities to understand locations important for conserving and restoring biodiversity
- identify the highest priority areas for habitat creation and connectivity
- provide guidance on actions on farmland and woodland to achieve nature recovery and move towards more sustainable farming practices
- help guide local communities with funding applications for nature recovery projects
- suggest potential measures for embedding nature into urban infrastructure, such as stormwater management
