



#### Stalls, Refreshments & Raffle

Our array of stalls drew plenty of visitors and thrived throughout the day. A few last-minute cancellations did cause a scramble, so we're considering taking deposits upfront next year to help with planning. The church stalls had mixed fortunes - while 'Splat the Rat' may be heading into retirement, the tombola was a runaway success, selling out by 3pm. ### M Charlton Village Community Hub Project Faces Setback

The Charlton Village Community Hub Committee and Parish Council have encountered a significant obstacle in their efforts to bring a new Community Hub to life.

After months of planning and collaboration, the team was poised to submit a formal Planning Application for the Hub, which was to be located on the car park. However, Salto - whose business operates on the site - has expressed serious concerns about the proposed location, stating that the build would severely impact their growing operations. As a result, they have declined to support the project in its current form.

Alternative locations within the car park have been explored, but each presents known planning challenges that make them unviable at this stage. This development comes as a bitter blow to those involved, especially given the promise the Hub held for enhancing village life.

The proposed design, developed by architects with sustainability at its core, had impressed many. Not only was it ecofriendly and thoughtfully integrated into the existing space, but it also managed to increase parking capacity to 72–80 spaces by reconfiguring underused areas.

A formal proposal to halt the Community Hub project in its current form will be presented to the Parish Council on Monday, 15th September. While this chapter may be closing, the Committee remains committed to exploring future possibilities that serve the needs of Charlton Village.

### ★ Footpaths Update: Seeking Solutions for Village Maintenance

The Parish Council has announced that, despite efforts to recruit locally, no volunteers have come forward to take on the role of Lengthsman—a key position responsible for maintaining footpaths and public spaces around Charlton Village.

In response, the Council is now exploring a short-term solution by letting a contract for essential maintenance work. This will ensure that the village remains safe, tidy, and accessible while a more permanent arrangement is considered.

The Council remains hopeful that someone from the community may still step forward to take on this valued role. In the meantime, residents are encouraged to report any urgent issues with footpaths or public areas to the Parish Clerk (detail on page 6)

### SO Recycle Planning Update

The proposed change of use for SO Recycle continues to raise concerns across neighbouring communities. The latest representation from Penton Mewsey strongly objects to the application, echoing worries already voiced by Charlton Parish Council.

Charlton PC remains particularly concerned about the traffic implications, with routing expected to send vehicles down Hatherden Road, through the heart of the village, and out along Goch Way—posing risks to safety and tranquillity.

Should the application appear likely to be approved, Charlton PC has formally requested that it be referred to the Northern Area Planning Committee. This would provide an opportunity for the Council to speak directly and ensure local voices are heard.



### **♠** Local Plan: Strong Community Response

Charlton residents turned out in force for the Public Meeting held at the church on 29th July, voicing clear and passionate objections to the proposed housing developments outlined in the Local Plan.

The plans include 135, 52, and 900 new homes—figures that have sparked widespread concern about the impact on infrastructure, traffic, and the character of the village.

The Parish Council has submitted a formal note to Caroline Nokes MP, who responded sympathetically to the community's concerns. Her reply has been shared on social media (our Facebook group – Charlton Community Chat) and posted on village notice boards for all to read.

The consultation period remains open until 5th September, and residents are strongly encouraged to submit their views before the deadline.


The event was more than just a celebration; it was a chance to check in with one another, reconnect, and enjoy the simple joy of being together.

### **New Village Shop Opens Its Doors!**

#### Exciting things are happening in Andover town centre!

Test Vally Borough Council have submitted a planning application for a brand-new theatre venue for The Lights - a major step forward for the town's regeneration plans.

Located right in the heart of town, opposite the Guildhall, the proposed venue will include:

- A 400+ seat auditorium with accessible seating on all levels
- Flexible performance and event spaces
- Dance studios and meeting rooms available for hire
- Welcoming social spaces, including café and bar areas

Designed by specialist theatre architects, Burrell Foley Fischer, the theatre will reflect Andover's heritage, while offering modern, accessible facilities that can accommodate a wide range of performances and community uses. It will also play a central role in enhancing Andover's daytime and evening economy, drawing more people into the town centre to support local businesses.





The project is part of the wider Andover Masterplan and is being supported by £18.3 million of funding from central government, secured to accelerate key regeneration projects in the town. It responds directly to local feedback — with nearly 80% of Andover residents calling for a new theatre in the town centre.




## Andover Man Nominated for Prestigious National Award

An Andover man has this week been announced as a nominee for a national award. Lee Pumfrey, an Electrical Engineer at local firm Deltic Solutions, has been shortlisted for the Rising Star award at this year's National Checkatrade Awards; an honour that shines a light on exceptional talents in the UK's skilled trades.

Lee is one of just a handful of finalists selected from over 2,000 nominations nationwide in the hotly contested category of Rising Star.

For Lee, 45, the nomination marks a major milestone in a career he has built from the ground up, given that he is a career



Recently that dedication earned him a promotion to Team Supervisor — a role that sees him overseeing electrical projects, mentoring new recruits, and making sure Deltic Solutions' reputation for first-class workmanship is upheld on every job.

Speaking shortly after the shortlist was revealed, Lee said:

"I'm still taking it in. It's a huge honour to be recognised like this. I've had the privilege of learning from some incredible people here in Andover, and now I get to share that knowledge with the next generation coming through."

The National Checkatrade Awards are regarded as one of the highest marks of recognition for tradespeople, celebrating everything from customer service to technical skill. The Rising Star category, in which Lee is nominated, is awarded to those who have made an exceptional impact early in their time within the trade — regardless of age.

Scott Alexander-Smith, Director at Deltic Solutions, said the announcement has been met with huge pride across the company:

"From day one, Lee demonstrated he had that rare combination of skill, reliability and passion for the work. He leads by example, and the quality of his results speaks for itself. He's the kind of person who doesn't just get the job done, he makes sure it's done to the highest standard every single time. Seeing him recognised nationally is a proud moment for his colleagues, friends & family across Test Valley."

The timing is also significant. With national attention often focused on big-city projects, Lee's story is a reminder that towns like Andover are home to world-class skills — and that home-grown talent can stand shoulder-to-shoulder with the best in the country.

The winners of the National Checkatrade Awards will be announced later this year at a lavish ceremony hosted at Portsmouth Football Club, just a short distance from Checkatrade's headquarters. Whether or not he takes home the trophy, Lee says he is "honoured" to have his work noticed at such a level.

"This town has been good to me," he said. "I hope this shows that you don't have to leave Andover to achieve big things. You can start right here and go as far as your hard work will take you."


