Parish Council Updates

First Aid Course Held at Charlton Village Church Hall

Charlton Village recently hosted a highly successful First Aid course in the church hall, providing those that joined us with essential life-saving skills.

The course, delivered by **Shona Wilkins**, from St John Ambulance <u>https://www.sja.org.uk/organised</u>, saw a great turnout, with participants eager to learn and enhance their ability to respond to emergencies.

The comprehensive training covered a range of crucial topics, including CPR and Defibrillation, Chest Pain, Unresponsive Breathing Casualties, Choking and how to deal with severe bleeds and common injuries. The hands-on approach allowed attendees to practice techniques under the guidance of experienced instructors, ensuring they left with confidence in their new skills.

Attendees were extremely grateful for this valuable opportunity...

"I'm so thankful for this course. It's empowering to know I can help in an emergency" - One participant shared

We're thrilled with the positive feedback and are already planning future sessions to continue supporting the well-being and safety of Charlton Village.



Exciting Plans for a New Community Hub in Charlton Village

We're exploring the idea of building a new Community Hub, a vibrant, multi-purpose space that will serve as the heart of our village.

A 'Community Hub Scoping' document has been sent to three different architects with the aim of engaging an architect to act as lead consultant, and to provide a concept design for a new, low rise building, to serve the Charlton community as a hub, or meeting place.

If all goes to plan we could get to a formal Planning Application next summer!

The proposed community hub will offer a variety of services and activities, and will be a focus for the village. This will include an information exchange point, a café, a small meeting room, a book exchange and it may also host local drop-in services such as Citizens Advice or Unity. The hub will be a place where everyone can come together.

We believe that a community hub will significantly enhance the quality of life in Charlton Village, providing a central location for resources and support. The hub will also offer opportunities for volunteering, enabling you to contribute to the well-being of our village.

Barry also won our **Charlton Village Community Volunteer Award 2024**, which will be presented to his widow, Linda.






Cherishing Our Heritage: Charlton Village Church Hosts Nostalgia Event


Recently our quaint village of Charlton came alive with memories and stories as residents gathered at the Charlton Village Church for a special Nostalgia Event, presented by Ray Sore.

Ray gave a really fascinating talk about Charlton Church and Charlton School, celebrating the rich history of our community. Over 20 people came out to join the discussion! His 'script' will be available on the PC website soon.

There were at least three attendees who are former students, and they shared some great stories. We also learned about the inappropriate warehouse built for Twining's Tea—320 feet long! It used to sit where Sunnyside Close is now, and thanks to the Parish Council of the day it was demolished to make way for the Sunnyside Close estate. The removal of the warehouse was a major achievement and evidence of people power!



The event was a great opportunity to gather



personal stories, photos, and scrapbooks to help create a comprehensive 'Charlton Archive'. As contributions poured in, it became clear that the Charlton Archive would be more than a repository of documents; it would be a living testament to the resilience, creativity, and camaraderie that define our village. Organisers expressed their excitement about the project, stating, "*Our goal is to create a lasting resource that reflects the heart and soul of Charlton. This archive will not only preserve our history for future generations but also celebrate the unique stories that bind us together*."



It was suggested we should also start to interview individuals and capture a voice record of the past so things do not just get lost in the mist of time. It was a good start to what is hoped to be an ongoing activity to produce a 'popular' record of this, and the last century in Charlton Village.

The term "Lengthsman" originated in the 1800s, designating workers tasked with maintaining a specific stretch of road in a tidy condition.

Each financial year, Hampshire County



Council allocates a small grant to each participating parish to support the Lengthsman's work, which typically amounts to approximately 40-50 hours annually.

Our Lengthsman, **Phil Wylde**, goes above and beyond, regularly trimming and clearing pathways throughout the village, often contributing more than what the grant covers.



But it's not all gloom; November brings fireworks that light up the sky like a disco for stars, and the promise of Christmas just around the corner, making it the ultimate teaser trailer for the festive season. So, grab your wellies and your sense of humor – you'll need both!

Gardening in November | Winter is on its way

Leaves are falling rapidly, and wind and rain are on the increase. Tender plants will need protecting from frost, gales and freezing rains. Move plants into the greenhouse, or into a sheltered spot, but if you can't, it is worth wrapping plants or pots. Remember winter can be a tough time for birds in terms of water and food, so keep supplies well topped up.



Here's the top five gardening tasks to focus on during November:

Plant Spring Bulbs:

This is the perfect time to plant tulip bulbs and other spring-flowering bulbs to ensure a vibrant display next year.

Tidy Up the Garden:

Clear away fallen leaves, debris, and dead plants. This not only helps keep your garden looking neat but also prevents pests and diseases from overwintering in your garden.

Mulching:

Apply a layer of mulch to garden beds and around perennials. This helps protect plant roots from frost, retains moisture, and suppresses weeds through the winter months.

Pruning:

Consider pruning deciduous trees and shrubs, especially those that flower in the spring. Removing dead or damaged branches will promote healthy growth in the spring.

Protecting Tender Plants:

Bring any tender plants indoors or provide protection for those left outside. Use fleece or bubble wrap to insulate plants that are not hardy enough to withstand winter frosts.

Remember, Remember, the 5th of November...

Every year on the 5th of November, the skies across the UK light up with vibrant fireworks, and communities come together to celebrate Bonfire Night, or Guy

Fawkes Night. This festive occasion not only entertains with dazzling displays but also serves as a reminder of an important historical event that shaped the nation.

Bonfire Night commemorates the failed Gunpowder Plot of 1605, when a group of conspirators, including Guy Fawkes, attempted to blow up the Houses of Parliament and assassinate King James I. Their aim was to end Protestant rule and restore a Catholic monarch to the throne. However, Fawkes and his accomplices were foiled in their plan, leading to their capture and execution. Since then, the 5th of November has been marked by celebrations, where bonfires are lit, effigies of Guy Fawkes are burned, and fireworks are set off in jubilant remembrance of the plot's failure.

Ride the Wave of BMX Excitement: Find out more about our local BMX Club!

As the dust settles on the exhilarating BMX competitions of the 2024 Olympics in Paris, it's clear that BMX racing has captured the hearts of millions around the world. The outstanding performances of UK riders, who displayed remarkable talent and determination, have ignited a newfound enthusiasm for the sport at home. Now, more than ever, is the perfect

time to embrace the BMX culture right in our own community — and there's no better place to start than at our local BMX club!

Established in 1996 and located at the Charlton Leisure Park, Andover BMX Club operates one of the few tracks in the South of England that conforms to British Cycling standards for regional level racing. BMX racing is not just a sport; it's a lifestyle that promotes fitness, friendship, and fun for all ages. From youngsters just beginning their journey on two wheels to seasoned pros, everyone is welcome.

There is much to shout about for Andover BMX Club in the last year or so... so the club have kindly shared a few highlights...

Andover BMX Highlights

The track itself had a major upgrade with the installation of floodlights enabling coaching and racing throughout the winter season. They were officially switched on by the deputy mayor on one of the coldest evening of last year, when we also held the very first "*Night race*" ever held in our region.

Many riders from other clubs have been utilising the floodlights and coming to our track for practice as there are very few who have floodlights at present (Gosport is the only other in our part of the world).

Just over 1 year ago, we had our first "World Plate" out of the club. A world plate is given to any rider who reaches the final in their category at the UCI BMX Racing World Championships, and they are permitted to race the next season with that number on their bike until the next World Championships takes place. Newton Hindley became World No 6 in the Cruiser 9-12 Category, having raced well all day at the 2023 World Champs in Glasgow. A great deal of media attention has been given to another rider out of Andover in the last year... Sarah Jane Nichols. Who is our eldest female rider at 54 years of age. She is a returning rider having been overall female world champion back in 1986 and she joined Andover a couple of years back with the intention of doing it for a bit of fun. Before long she was competing nationally again and began training for this year's world championships (in Rock Hill, USA). Her story is here:

Over the August bank holiday weekend, we attended the British Championships in Derby for the annual "BMX Festival." The event was a tremendous success, with Andover BMX Club shining brightly. Among the 1400+ riders, 39 represented Andover, and we proudly had 12 finalists, including 4 podium finishes. An outstanding achievement for all our riders!


